Archiving Intangible Heritage Footprints: Experiential and Conscious Educational Learning

The proposed Faculty Training Program, themed "Archiving Intangible Heritage Footprints: Experiential and Conscious Educational Learning.", seeks to reframe how heritage is documented and understood within architectural education. Recognizing that much of India's cultural wealth lies not just in physical structures but in living traditions, oral histories, rituals and local narratives, this program aims to develop a new pedagogical lens rooted in empathy, experience, and humanized storytelling.

Phase -01 (ONLINE FTP)

OBJECTIVE: Integrating Intangible Heritage into Architectural Education

This program aims to sensitize faculty to the significance of intangible heritage in architectural education by introducing ethical, immersive documentation methods such as oral histories and cultural practices. It promotes humanized mapping that emphasizes empathy and lived experiences, while fostering interdisciplinary collaboration through peer-learning workshops. The initiative also sets the stage for future student-led projects and faculty-guided public documentation.

LEARNING OUTCOME:

The program fosters a new pedagogy by helping faculty integrate experiential, community-based learning aligned with NEP goals into architectural education. It provides a structured framework for documenting intangible heritage—rituals, beliefs, crafts, and oral histories—using humanized, ethical approaches. Through expert mentorship and hands-on sessions, faculty enhance their skills in research, storytelling, and field engagement. Institutions collaboratively develop publication-ready documentation proposals with mentor support, contributing to a national-level initiative. The program ultimately positions faculty as enablers of conscious learning, guiding students toward empathetic, culturally sensitive design thinking grounded in real-world heritage contexts.

Phase -02 (HYBRID MODE)

OBJECTIVE: Archiving Intangible Heritage Footprints Through Field Documentation & Collaborative Publication

This phase aims to engage trained faculty and mentors in the live documentation of intangible heritage at selected sites, fostering inter-school collaboration through joint fieldwork and narrative development. It envisions the co-authorship of a scholarly, visual, and culturally rich publication that highlights India's lesser-known heritage. The initiative also empowers students and faculty to deepen their learning and gain national recognition as contributors to an academic resource.

Structure of Part 2

Call for Collaborating Colleges

We invite institutions across India to become active collaborators in this second phase. Each college is requested to:

- Nominate two faculty members (trained in Part 1)
- Host on-site documentation with selected students and assigned mentors
- Submit one chapter for the final publication

Centralized Training by COA

- Any faculty or institution interested in participating in Phase 2 shall inform the Council of Architecture.
- A dedicated training session for Phase 2 will be conducted only by COA. This session will guide faculty on how to carry out documentation in an ethical, immersive, and scholarly manner.

Editorial Consolidation and Final Publication

- A book will be launched nationally at the COA Excellence Awards Ceremony, ensuring wide visibility.
- It will be jointly edited by the Sir MVSA with support of COA.
- The publication will feature multi-authored chapters, with individual copyright for each contributing institution.

Site Engagement with Collaborating Colleges

• Chapter Development: Each college will contribute a unique chapter based on their site-specific narrative, co-authored by students and faculty. Hands-on Learning: Faculty and students will undertake primary data collection through immersive, humanized, and participatory methods.
